Summer Term Week 4 Year 3

Mathematics

This week, we are going to continue to look at money.

Monday: Today, we are going to look at <u>converting pounds into pence</u>. Remember there are 100p in £1.

Tuesday: Have a go at <u>adding amounts of money</u>.

Thursday: Draw a picture of some coins and notes. You need to draw 2 pictures of the same coin e.g.



With a partner, you can play the game 'snap'. Here are the instructions:

Money snap

Shuffle the cards and divide between 2 players, picture side down. Take it in turns to show one card at a time, make a one pile in front of you.

When two of the same coin pictures are revealed, one after another, the first player to shout 'snap!' receives all the cards on the pile.

Play continues until one player has all the cards.

Friday: Make some price tags and place them on items in your house. Using your addition and subtraction skills from earlier in the week, see what your total is when you buy some of the things.

Challenge: How much change will get from £20.00 if you buy 3 items?

£10 £1.20 £5 £2 60p £15.99 £8.00 20p

Tuesday

Today, you are going to use <u>commas in a list</u>. What do you know about the Captain? Can you write some sentences including commas in a list e.g. The Captain wore jet black boots, a filthy, blue jacket and an old, ripped shirt. **Challenge:** Extend your lists using expanded noun phrases (e.g. an old, ripped shirt.)

Wednesday

Practise using possessive apostrophes.
Can you write some sentences about the
Captain using possessive apostrophes? (e.g.
The Captain's coat was filthy and ripped)
Challenge: Can you include a plural possessive apostrophe? (e.g. The boots' soles were worn out)

Thursday

Which openers would you use in a biography? Choose a <u>biography</u> to read on the website and find all the openers.

Now write your own sentences about the Captain using some of the openers you found. Remember to use a comma after your opener! There are some more openers on the website to help you.

Challenge: Decide whether the openers you have used describe a time, place or cause. (e.g. In 1960- time, On the ship- place, Because he was nasty- cause).






