English (Writing)

<u>Read</u> or <u>listen</u> to chapter 4 of The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas. Below are activities to complete across the week leading up to writing



Activity 1 –

Recap <u>descriptive writing</u>. Have a look out of a window in your house. What do you see? What do you hear? What can you smell? Using <u>expanded noun phrases</u>, write sentences about what you can see from your window. Remember to try to up level your vocab.

Activity 2 –

Using your sentences from activity 1, use <u>ISPACE</u> to add openers to your sentences. Try adding one example of each to your sentences and punctuate your sentences correctly. Remember to make your sentences multiclausal – can you add a subordinate clause at the beginning or end? Or can you add a relative clause? Use correct conjunctions when needed as well.

Activity 3 –

Look at <u>these</u> examples of descriptive writing. Choose 2 of them to look at in detail. Can you spot any elements of <u>MAPSO</u>? Write down any you find and label them. Can you also find any expanded noun phrases? What up levelled vocab can you find?

Activity 4&5 –

Plan, write and edit a description of what Bruno and Gretel see out of the bedroom window. Remember to use the skills that you have practiced this week and really show your work off! Your writing should be at least 2 decent sized paragraphs.

research Thomas Edison.


Write a biography about Thomas Edison
