




Dunstall Hill Primary Home Learning






- Have a go at making your own taste safe mud, following this recipe.
- 2 tablespoons of cocoa powder
- 1 cup of flour
- 3/4 to 1 cup of water

Mix the water, cocoa powder and flour until the mixture has a mudlike look to it. Add some toys or use your finger to mark make in the mixture.

• Try a <u>floating egg experiment</u>, get 2 glasses and add water to both. In 1 of the glasses add 1 or 2 tablespoons of salt. Now place an egg in each glass. What has happened? Why does 1 egg float and the other sink? Are there any other liquids that will have the same effect?



Exercise/PE

In addition to your daily exercise the Government have recommended, we try to aim for at least another 30 minutes if possible. See below for some useful resources:

 Practise hopping and jumping by playing a game of hopscotch. Make your own using paper or chalk on the ground.



• Develop your ball skills. See if you can

throw, catch, kick, pass, bat and aim with a range of different sized balls.

 Try <u>Andy's wild</u> <u>workout</u>, in this episode Andy is in the undergrowth.

Try <u>teddy bear</u> <u>meditation</u>, lie down on your back with a teddy on your tummy.




Breathe in and out slowly and focus on how the bear moves up and down.

 Make a <u>meditation jar</u>. Fill a jar or plastic bottle ¾ of the way with warm

water, add clear glue, food colouring and glitter. Shake the jar and watch as the glitter settles.
