As summer approaches we have started planning fun outdoor activities in the school garden and forest area. We have been busy planting a variety of vegetables and


herbs that will be ready to harvest later

We also have a variety of fruit and vegetables growing in our greenhouse and can't wait to start our Gardening Club again next term!









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



Nursery have working been this hard half term, focusing on our topic hungry tummies. We have spent some time over the last weeks few watching our class caterpillars grow and transform into

making a pirate treasure map and making our own marks to find the treasure.





As part of our Design and Technology topic, Year 2 explored different types of bread and then designed and made their own





The River Nile

In geography, the children in **Year 4** have been learning about the features of a river. We have explored the River Nile and discovered why it was so important to the people living in ancient

Egypt. The children created their own physical maps to show the natural features found in Egypt.

wanted to make a mummy? If you want to find out how to perform this

ancient ritual, then pop down to Year 4 to read our incredible, detailed

instructions. This term, we have learnt about the process of mummification. To do this, we followed a set of instructions to mummify tomatoes.





Successful Structures

In Design and Technology, we have been looking at structures. We discussed how triangles help to strengthen a structure. Our project was to create a structure to transport water from the River Nile to the farms to help grow the crops. Take a look at some of our creations:









Year 4 watched a performance by the Wolverhampton Music Service and enjoyed listening to some familiar songs. It was so lovely hearing live music fill Dunstall's corridors!

This term, Year 5 have started a new topic on the Mayans. We had so much fun learning about their writing system and designed our own Mayan alphabet, by taking inspiration from their logograms and syllabograms. We also enjoyed playing pok-ta-pok (similar to football), where we were only able to use our hips, knees and elbows to pass the ball! It was challenging but great fun! Here is a picture to show you the range of activities that we took part in over the term.



Year 5 have also been very busy learning how to sew, as part of DT and Geography. The children were taught three different techniques: running stitch, backward stitch



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and cross-stitch, which they all mastered. They really enjoyed learning this new skill whilst learning about the different elements of the water-cycle. Here are a few pictures of our creations.





In Science, Year 5 have been learning about different properties and changes in materials. They relished working collaboratively to separate the different

mixtures using a range of equipment including: sieves, colanders, filter paper and funnels. We thoroughly enjoyed taking part in this science investigation

and can't wait to continue learning about properties and changes in materials over the next term.





Year 6

As part of our Science 'Electricity' topic, we completed a carousel of challenges to apply all of our learning. Pupils had to follow circuit diagrams and build the correct circuit, complete mini investigations recording predictions and conclusions, draw circuit diagrams for given circuits and make comparisons between different series and parallel circuits.



During our WW2 topic we looked at weaponry used during the war, the roles of WW2 soldiers and the uniforms they wore. Alongside this, we considered what it would have been like for a soldier at this time including the physical and emotional hardships. We used our ideas from this week of work and completed a piece of art to reflect our thoughts.



When looking at rationing during WW2, pupils learned why rationing was introduced, about the quantities allowed of each food

per person per week and created a poster to show our learning. We then followed a wartime recipe for 'oaty biscuits' which reflected a family's weekly rations. We loved making them and all agreed that they tasted great!



Royal Mail Competition










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
