Reception

This half term, Reception have been learning all about real life superheroes. We have been thinking about the people in our community and how they help us from day to day. Children have loved playing in our roleplay veterinary area. Children practice opportunities to develop their language skills, experimenting with the phrases and tones of voice a vet might use. Through this role play, children developed a range of PSED skills, such as: taking turns, negotiating, sharing, working together, and considering the feelings of others and their imaginary patients.





Reception children have been super creative this half term designing and making their very own Supertato and Evil Pea using loose parts. Children used objects such as feathers, lollipop sticks and sequins to decorate their very own 'Supertato'.





The Reception children did a fantastic job at creating wanted posters to catch Evil Pea as he was causing a lot of trouble in our school.





For Refugee Week, Reception children explored some stories such 'Coming to England' F.Benjamine and 'My name is not refugee' Kate by Milner.



We discussed and looked at different cultures and pictures. Children enjoyed making their own paperchain person with different items of clothing. Then we connected them together to display in the classroom.

For our Literacy session, we read the story 'My name is not refugee'. The children learned about empathy and began to understand how refugee children feel. The children wrote a list about things they would like to carry in their bags.

During circle time, we have enjoyed singing and learning to say hello to our friends in different languages. We also created different obstacle courses to look at how we travel on different journeys.

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Year 4

This term, the children in Year 4 have learnt what coorinates are. They explored this through the markings on the playground and were able to plot, write and translate coordinates, challenging each other in the first quadrant.

time taking part in a vareity of sporting events. These were led by Mr Grazier, our regular school sports coach. Judging by the photos, the children certainly adopted an active and enthusiastic approach towards the activities on offer. Needless to say, there was some stiff competition amongst the Year 4s!













As part of our printing unit in art, the children completed relief painting inspired by our artist Henri Rousseau. They used polystyrene to create a repeated pattern using a range of tools to carve their designs, taking into consideration how much detail was needed. Their repeated patterns represented plants and animals found in the rainforest



This term, the children in Year 4 have been very innovative. The children were given half of a rainforest animal's face and they had to complete the face, using their knowledge of symmetry. The children chose the media they wished to use to complete their pictures. They chose from sketching pencils, oil pastels, watercolor paint, biro, charcoal and colouring pencils.
