English

This term in English the children will be reading fiction and non-fiction texts. The first text will be "Wolfs in the walls" from which they will then write their own scary story, for their parents. The second text will be a non-fiction text about predators. They will then choose their own predator and write some interesting facts that will be shared with a year 4 class. This will allow the year 4 class to learn some new things about different animals that year 5 had picked. Finally, we will have a week of poetry where the children will read some poems and learn one by heart and present it to their class.

PF

Pe will be on Thursdays and all children need to bring in their PE kit. Children will be taking part in Dance with a focus on Rock and Roll. They will learn a series of steps and moves linked to the theme of Rock and Roll.

Mathematics

This term, we will continue to focus on embedding place value skills and rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10000. There will be a strong focus on developing mental strategies used in solving addition and subtraction calculations. Throughout the teaching of the different maths skills, children will be exposed to more challenging reasoning and problem-solving questions.

In arithmetic, we will focus on developing formal written methods for addition and subtraction. Children will be introduced to multiplying whole numbers with up to four digits by a two digit number.

Knowledge Subjects
